ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

4.2 Regular Commission appointments are made at the June Board of Crook County Commissioners meeting, to take effect July 1st. Elections are held by the Commission the first meeting after the July Board of Crook County Commissioners meeting.

4.3 Officer vacancies shall be filled by the remaining members on the Commission to fill the remaining unexpired term(s) caused by a vacancy.

4.4 Members of the Commission shall not receive salary for their services but, by resolution of the Commission and approval by the Board of Crook County Commissioners, expenses may be paid for attendance at any meeting of the Commission or at any Sub-committee meetings, or any special meetings a member or Sub-committee member or special appointed committee member may be directed to attend.

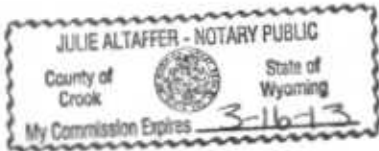

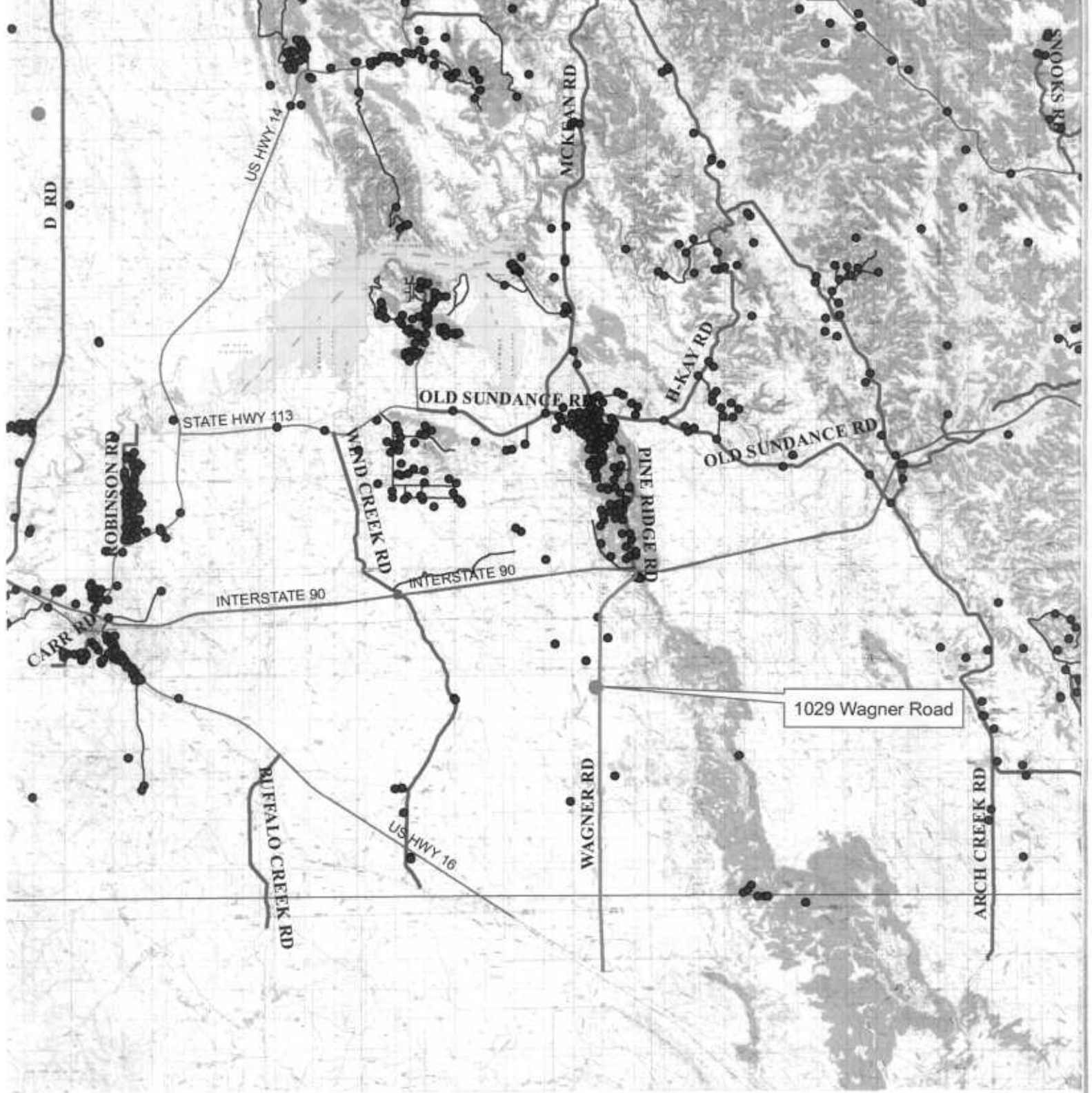

The Biodiversity Conservation Alliance has identified you as a surface or mineral owner within the area commonly known as Sand Creek. The Environmental Quality Council (EQC) is notifying you that the Biodiversity Conservation Alliance has filed a petition to designate the area known as Sand Creek located in Crook County as rare or uncommon pursuant to Section 35-11-112 of the Environmental Quality Act. The EQC has scheduled a meeting on this petition for July 14, 2009 at 9:00 A.M. The EQC has a meeting scheduled at the Crook County Court House, 308 Cleveland St., Sundance, WY. Anyone wishing to hear the discussion should plan on being at the meeting.

The scheduled meeting will address whether the EQC should move forward with the petition. It is not a hearing on whether the area should be designated. Please see Chapter VII, Section 6(b) of the DEQ Rules of Practice and Procedure. Dear Mr. Boal and members of the Environmental Quality Council,

We, the members of the Crook County Land Use Planning and Zoning Commission and are appointed to this commission are citizens that work and live in Crook County, are very concerned about the potential designation of the Sand Creek area as Very Rare and Uncommon. After review of the latest petition filed on May 22, 2009, by the Biodiversity Conservation Alliance, we wish to submit the following comments for your consideration.

As the petition states, Sand Creek currently has the strong protection as a Class I waterway. The area also contains two special designations, a Botanical Area and a Late Successional Forest Landscape. The area's wonderful but entirely common characteristics and resources are already being given special management consideration by the U. S. Forest Service.

In the 1998 Land Use Plan for Crook County (page 1), it states the county's intention "to coordinate with federal and state agencies on their proposed actions that may potentially affect the management of private and public land and natural resource use." It also established that "Crook County will coordinate on the proposed actions so Crook County citizens may preserve their customs, culture, and economic stability while protecting and using their environment."

We believe the Council's upcoming decision to either deny or pursue the petitioners' request will have a direct negative impact on the customs, culture, and economy of Crook County. Because such a designation would adversely impact the multiple use activities historically enjoyed in the Sand Creek watershed and surrounding area, we are opposed to the Very Rare and uncommon designation being proposed.
