AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR CROOK COUNTY, WYOMING

WHEREAS, the Board of the County Commissioners in and for Crook County, Wyoming desires to purchase Lot 14 of Block 13 and Lot 12 of Block 16 of the Railroad Addition to the Town of Sundance, Crook County, Wyoming next to the old Weed and Pest Building in Sundance, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS the current owner, Kevin Bertagnolli has accepted the offer pursuant to Sales Agreement with the County to Quitclaim his interest in said property for the back taxes due on the property of approximately \$1,408.59 (to be paid to the certificate of purchase holders), an appraisal of the property, and the costs associated with the transfer pursuant to the Sales Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the County Commissioners in and for Crook County, Wyoming have determined that it is in the best interest at this time to acquire the above described real property to make better use of the old Weed and Pest Building when the opportunity and need arise in the future.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of the County Commissioners in and for Crook County, Wyoming is authorized to purchase Lot 14 of Block 13 and Lot 12 of Block 16 of the Railroad Addition to the Town of Sundance, Crook County, Wyoming next to the old Weed and Pest Building in Sundance, Wyoming; and authorizes the chairman of the Board to sign any documents necessary or authorize any expenses to complete the transaction.

Jim moved to approve the tax assessment of the Crook County Irrigation District for 2010 and to approve the tax assessment of the Sundance Canyon Ranch Improvement and Service District for 2010. Kelly seconded, all ayes, motion carried. Also present was Dee Griffis, County Assessor.

Dee Griffis, County Assessor, presented tax roll corrections. Jim moved to approve the following tax roll corrections and Orders Refunding Interest Due: 2005-160; 2006-153; 2007-266; 2007-267; 2007-0500; 2008-263; 2009-80. Kelly seconded, all ayes, motion carried.

Jim moved to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION AND ORDINANCE NO. 2010-6
CONTINUATION OF THE 1% SALES TAX (the 5th cent)
FOR GENERAL PURPOSES

WHEREAS, an excise tax of 1% (the 5th cent) to be used for general purposes has been imposed, following the last approval by the electorate in 1990 and has been continued by the city, towns and county in Crook County, Wyoming every four (4) years since that time in accordance with Wyoming Statute 39-6-412 which was amended in 1998 to Wyoming Statute 39-15-203 and 39-16-203; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Wyoming Statute 39-15-203(a)(i)(F) and 39-16-203(a)(i)(F), such tax may be continued without the requirement of further, periodic reapprovals by the electorate at a general election if favorably supported by a resolution adopted by the County and an ordinance adopted by at least a majority of the incorporated municipalities within the County at least 90 days prior to the election at which such reapproval would have been necessary; and

WHEREAS, all of the incorporated municipalities in Crook County, Wyoming, which includes the Towns of Hulett, Moorcroft, Pine Haven, and City of Sundance, have enacted and passed Ordinances that "support and endorse the continuation of the 1% excise tax imposed on all retail sales of tangible personal property, admissions

and services and upon sales, storage, use and consumption of tangible personal property in Crook County, Wyoming, authorized under Wyoming Statute 39-15-204(a)(i) and 39-16-204(a)(i);” and

WHEREAS, Crook County endorses and supports the continuation of the 1% (the 5th cent) excise tax to be used for general purposes, imposed on all retail sales of tangible personal property, admissions and services, and upon sales, storage, use and consumption of tangible personal property in Crook County, Wyoming, authorized under Wyoming Statute 39-15-204(a)(i) and 39-16-204(a)(i) for the purpose of general revenue for Crook County, Wyoming.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR CROOK COUNTY, WYOMING, to support and endorse the continuation of the 1% (5th cent) excise tax imposed on all retail sales of tangible personal property, admissions and services and upon sales, storage, use and consumption of tangible personal property in Crook County, Wyoming, authorized under Wyoming Statute 39-15-204(a)(i) and 39-16-204(a)(i) to be used for general purposes to be distributed to the City of Sundance, Towns of Moorcroft, Hulett and Pine Haven, and Crook County as required by law.

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR CROOK COUNTY, WYOMING, that the following Resolution and/or Ordinance be adopted:

Section 1: Crook County hereby imposes and authorizes the continuation of the 1% excise tax imposed on all retail sales of tangible personal property, admissions and services, and upon sales, storage, use and consumption of tangible personal property made within Crook County, Wyoming, authorized by Wyoming Statute 39-15-204(a)(i) and 39-16-204(a)(i).

Section 2: The provisions of Wyoming Statute 39-15-101 et seq. Article 1 Chapter 15 are hereby adopted by reference except for Wyoming Statute 39-15-102(a), and Wyoming Statute 39-16-101 et seq. Article 1 Chapter 16 are hereby adopted by reference except for Wyoming Statute 39-16-102(a), insofar as it relates to sales taxes, except that the name of “Crook County” as the taxing agency shall be substituted for that of the “State” and an additional license to engage in business shall not be required if the vendor has been issued a state license pursuant to law.

Section 3: Any amendment made to Title 39 Chapter 16 not in conflict with Article 1 of Chapter 15 or to Chapter 16 shall automatically become a part of this sales tax resolution and or ordinance; and any amendment made to Title 39 Chapter 15 not in conflict with Article 1 of Chapter 16 or to Chapter 15 shall automatically become a part of this sales tax resolution and or ordinance.

Section 4: Crook County shall contract with the Department of Revenue of the State of Wyoming prior to the effective date of the County sales tax ordinance whereby the Department of Revenue shall perform all functions incident to the administration of this sales tax ordinance.

Section 5: The amount subject to the tax shall not include the amount of any sales imposed by the State of Wyoming.

Section 6: If any part of this Ordinance is invalid the remaining portion shall be construed in such a manner as to remain valid.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk shall immediately certify to the County Treasurer that a sufficient number of resolutions and ordinances to continue the tax have been adopted at least 90 days prior to the election and the County Treasurer shall, within five (5) days of the undersigned date, notify the Department of Revenue of the State of Wyoming of the foregoing, and such tax shall be continued until it is terminated in the manner provided by law.

Warren Oyler, Resident Engineer, Wyoming Department of Transportation, gave an update on bridge and road projects. Also present was Morgan Ellsbury, Road and Bridge Foreman.

Karen Ackerman, A.D.I. Insurance Agency, was present for the opening of the County property insurance bids. The following bid was received:

A.D.I. Insurance Agency-----\$45,174.00 with terrorism coverage and \$43,858.00 without terrorism coverage.

The Board will review the bid received and Ms. Ackerman will present more information at the Commissioners meeting in August.

Jim Pridgeon, Homeland Security County Coordinator and Gari Gill, County Fire Warden, gave a monthly report. Also present was Joe Baron, County Attorney. Jim moved to approve a Cooperative Helicopter Operating Plan 2010 Annual Operating Season to Cooperative Helicopter Agreement Between USDA, Forest Service, Black Hills National Forest, Nebraska National Forest and USDI, National Park Service, Wind Cave National Park and USDI, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Pine Ridge Agency and State of South Dakota, SD Department of Agriculture, Division of Forestry and Crook County, Wyoming. Kelly seconded, all ayes, motion carried.

Morgan Ellsbury, Road and Bridge Foreman, Randy Gill, Facilities Maintenance Foreman and Theresa Curren, Secretary, Public Works Department, gave a monthly report. Also present were LuAnn Jacobson, Paul Jacobson, Norval Waller, Viewer, Joe Baron, County Attorney, John Swenson, Perry Livingston, Arlene Tenke, Joyce Speidel, Ronald Brunner, Wayne Wilson, Attorney, Scott Beachler and Robin Mattson, Town of Moorcroft.

Norval Waller, Viewer, gave a Viewer's Report on the Petition to Vacate a County Road No. 98 known as the Sundance Newcastle County Road. Norval recommended that County Road No. 98 be vacated. No oral or written objections were received. The Board will proceed with the vacating procedures and will have the County Attorney draft a resolution to commence proceedings.

Norval Waller, Viewer, gave a Viewer's Report on the Petition to Vacate a County Road known as the Cold Springs County Road No. 21, also known as the Black and Yellow Road, a Petition to Vacate a County Road known as the Lost Canon County Road No. 56, also known as Lost Canyon Road and a Petition to Vacate a County Road known as the Stanton County Road No. 181, also known as Buckhorn Road.

Norval recommended that County Roads No. 21, No. 56 and No. 181 not be vacated. Discussion was held. Jim moved not to proceed to vacate County Roads No. 21, No. 56 and No. 181, upon the Viewer's appraisal. Kelly seconded, all ayes, motion carried.

Robin Mattson, Town of Moorcroft, requested for the Town of Moorcroft to take over Carr County Road No. 240 and would like to have a minimum of a single cable guard rail on the west side approximately 200 feet and nothing on the east side and chevrons on the northwest corner of the Rush Creek Crossing. Wyoming Retirement County Law Enforcement Employee share will be paid by the County----8.6%

Wyoming Retirement County Law Enforcement Employer match will be paid by the County---8.6%

Ernie Reinhold, Crook County Community Juvenile Services, gave an update on the Crook County Juvenile Services program. Also present were Joe Baron, County Attorney and Ogden Driskill.

Corey Price and Scott Jarvis, Sand Creek Trading Post, LLC dba Sand Creek Trading Post, requested a Special Twenty-Four Hour Catering Permit and Scott Jarvis requested a Special Twenty-Four Hour Malt Beverage Permit. Jim moved to approve a Special Twenty-Four Hour Catering Permit to Sand Creek Trading Post, LLC dba Sand Creek Trading Post for a wedding reception on July 17, 2010 and to approve a Special Twenty-Four Hour Malt Beverage Permit to Scott Jarvis for a Kenny Miller Benefit Show on July 18, 2010.
