

POLICY ON PLACING SIGNS UPON COUNTY ROAD RIGHT OF WAYS

This policy of the Board of County Commissioners is for placing signs upon county roads. This policy is necessary since various persons have requested traffic signs upon the county in Crook County. This policy is not binding upon the Board of County Commissioners but is an attempt at a guideline to best use the limited resources of Crook County.


1. To start the process the Applicant requesting a sign be placed upon a county road shall make the request in writing to the County Road and Bridge Superintendent.
2. The Applicant shall provide what type of sign is being requested and where it should be generally located. A form shall be created by the County Road and Bridge Superintendent and provided to the Applicant.
3. The County Road and Bridge Superintendent or his designee shall determine the type, location and cost of the sign. Signage shall be the type and construction that is approved by WYDOT.
4. This information shall be given to the Applicant.
5. When the Applicant has paid the County for the cost of the sign the County shall order the sign and install it within a reasonable time.
6. Once installed the sign will be owned and maintained by the County as the County sees fit.
7. All signs will be installed pursuant to WYDOT standards.
8. No other signs shall be placed upon the County Road Right of Ways which are 33 feet from the centerline of the road unless otherwise indicated by easements, dedications, or lane fences.
9. Any sign placed within a County Road Right of Way may be removed by the County as they see fit.
10. The cost of the sign may be waived for certain traffic control signs by the Road and Bridge Superintendent.




